**Co-organized by:** Department of Education- Cagayan de Oro City Division and Misamis Oriental Division

1. The contest is open to all public and private 4<sup>th</sup> year high school students.
2. Participating school is allowed with a maximum of two (2) contestants/representatives and one-teacher-coach but not to exceed thirty (30) participants per division.
3. Contestants should wear their complete school uniform during the contest. Contestants who are not wearing the prescribed attire will be automatically disqualified.
4. Content of questions are based on the Consumer Act of the Philippines, Price Act, Fair Trade Laws, and other Consumer Related Laws and Policies of the Department of Trade and Industry, the Department of Energy (DOE).
5. Contestants are provided with tug board, chalk and eraser for their use during the contest.
6. English is the official language in the conduct of the questions.
7. There are 20 questions to be given, 10 of which are easy questions, 5 questions are average, and the other five questions are difficult.
8. Points given to every correct answer are as follows:
  - One (1) point for easy question
  - Two (2) points for average question
  - Three (3) points for difficult question
9. Each question is to be read twice by the quiz master. Countdown starts after the question has been read for the second time.
10. Each question is given ten (10) seconds to answer.
11. Contestant is allowed to change/erase the answer within the allotted time of the question.
12. Wrong spelling wrong
13. The winners will be proclaimed based on cumulative scoring system.
14. In case of tie, there will be a set (set of 3) of tie breaking questions for those concerned contestants.
15. There will be three judges to score the answers.
16. There will be three winners and they will be qualified to join the regional contest.
17. Protest or inquiry is to be addressed orally to the chair of the Board of Judges and the decision of the Board is final.
18. Prize will be awarded to the 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 3<sup>rd</sup> place winners.
