PRESIDENTIAL DIRECTIVES ON COVID – 19 RESPONSE AND VACCINATION PROGRAM

**To: PUBLIC SCHOOLS DISTRICT SUPERVISORS/ DISTRICT IN – CHARGE
EMENTARY AND SECONDARY SCHOOL PRINCIPALS/ SCHOOL HEADS
SCHOOL HEALTH PERSONNEL
All others concerned**

1. The Department of Health (DOH) Memorandum dated July 6, 2022, on the subject Presidential Directives on COVID – 19 Response and Vaccination Program duly approved by President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr aims to reach **90% coverage for primary series of the A2 population (Senior Citizens) and 50% coverage for the first booster of the general population on or before the President's First 100 days on or before October 8, 2022.**
2. The above shall be the main conditions before we could safely remove our masks, fully open schools, remove travel restrictions and limit the use of Alert Level Systems as an internal planning and activation tool.
3. Relative to this, all schools are advised to:
 - a. To set up vaccination site in your school and DepEd Offices
 - b. Schedule a family vaccination among your employees, family members, friends, nearby residents, and target clients 5 years old and above this August 1 -31, 2022.
 - c. Cascade this directive to your local government units (LGU) for efficient COVID – 19 Vaccination Program
 - d. Proper recording and uploading of data are advised to keep track of our target
 - e. Recommended **Minimum Health Standard** should be closely observed during the conduct of the activity
4. Attached is the **PinasLakas Vaccination Guidelines** of the Department of Health (DOH) Center for Health Development – Northern Mindanao for guidance
