In consonance with the Regional Memorandum No. 677, s. 2018, re: Monitoring of Support to NSPC Qualifiers, this Office encourages all **School heads** of the Coaches, School Paper Advisers and campus journalists whose school publication qualifies for the National Schools Press Conference namely: **Linubihan**: Aplaya ES, **The Flash**: Jasaan NHS, **MisOrient Torch**: MOGCHS, **Sudsud**: Initao NCHS, **Ang Cantago**: Tagoloan NHS, **Ang Sapyaw**: Initao NCHS, **Ang Gintong Bagwis**: MOGCHS and **Ang Siklab**: Jasaan NHS to note the following supports which are as follows:

- a. School Paper Qualifiers for the NSPC
 1. Provide one (1) week time to work on the school publication, incorporating all comments and feedback from the recently concluded paper enhancement activity and come up with a final copy for the national school paper contest. The activity shall start on **November 12-21, 2018**. The enhanced and final copy of the school paper shall be submitted at the Division Office on **November 22, 2018**, Attention: Maria Teresa M. Absin;
 2. Source out funds for printing the school publication per R.A. 7079; and
 3. Charge travel and other related expenses of the activity to local funds, school MOOE, PTA funds, or any other source of funds, subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and procedures.
- b. Individual and Group Contests Qualifiers
 1. Officially excuse the learners from their classes during enhancement activities and trainings on **November 23-December 3, 2018**;
 2. Provide reasonable time for learners to make up for missed examinations and classes through modules and/or any of the most appropriate forms of alternative assessment aligned with the required target competencies;
 3. Give reasonable grades to learners based on their performance after the examinations or interventions;
 4. Give points for their co-curricular exemplary performance based on D.O. No. 74, s. 2012; and
 5. Inform all concerned persons, including parents of learners and subject teachers

This Region

1. To monitor the outputs and outcomes of trainings conducted by the entire region in preparation for the National Schools Press Conference, all divisions are encouraged to provide support and monitoring system for all activities conducted by the schools for the annual competition in journalism.
2. The support and monitoring will not be limited to the following:
 - a. School Paper Qualifiers for the NSPC
 - i. Provide one (1) week time to work on the school publication, incorporating all comments and feedback from the recently concluded paper enhancement activity and come up with a final copy for the national school paper contest;
 - ii. Source out funds for printing the school publication per RA 7079; and
 - iii. Charge travel and other related expenses of the activity to local funds, school MOOE, PTA funds, or any other source of funds, subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and procedures.
 - b. Individual and Group Contests Qualifiers
 - i. Officially excuse the learners from their classes during enhancement activities and trainings;
 - ii. Provide reasonable time for learners to make up for missed examinations and classes through modules and/or any of the most appropriate forms of alternative assessment aligned with the required target competencies;
 - iii. Give reasonable grades to learners based on their performance after the examinations or interventions;
 - iv. Give points for their co-curricular exemplary performance based on DO 74, s. 2012; and
 - v. Inform all concerned persons, including parents of learners and subject teachers.



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3. The active participation and exemplary performance of learners in academics, athletics, and the arts, and/or in DepEd-recognized activities bring honor to the schools they represent and to the entire region in general; hence, giving them reasonable **special considerations** will be meaningful.
4. This policy shall remain in force effective immediately for all co-curricular programs recognized by this Office, unless sooner repealed, amended, or rescinded.
