Mapping the Unmapped

- Check the master list of the schools:
 - bit.ly/depedschools-public
 - bit.ly/depedschools-private
 - bit.ly/depedoffices

This will lead you to a Google spreadsheet.
- If the school has its **Latitude** and **Longitude**, this means that the school is mapped. Otherwise, if it says "**(blank)**", visit the websites below to get the coordinates.

<http://maps.google.com> or <https://www.bing.com/maps/>
- Locate the area where the school is using the **+** button to zoom in (you may also **double click**) or the **-** button to zoom out. To move across the map, use the **Pan Button** or by **dragging the mouse** to the school location.

Use the **Earth/satellite view** to locate the school.
- Once the school has been located, **right-click** on the center of the school.
- Select **What's here?**
- In the search box at the top of the page, the latitude and longitude of the school will appear. It is separated by a comma, **","**
- Copy the latitude and longitude on the Google spreadsheet. Do not to include the comma.
- The Google spreadsheet will automatically save and the location of the school is already updated.

Note:

- If the satellite images in Google are not clear, you may check out Bing Maps.
- In Bing Maps, change "Road" view into "Automatic" for satellite imagery.
