# **Kuyamis Festival 2016**

*"Explore the Amazing Secrets of Misamis Oriental."*

## **INTRODUCTION**

The earliest known settlers of the territory were the Negritos. Centuries later, people of Malay descent with various blend of Mongolic characteristics fought against the natives for control of the Cagayan river coastal plains. The struggle for the possession of land went on between different evolving races until the native Visayans, the offshoot of lowland inhabitants, won over the Bukidnons. In the 1500's, most of the areas in Mindanao had fallen under the Muslim sway and the inhabitants were converted to Islam. Misamis Oriental, however, was only nominally under Muslim rule with an obligation to pay a yearly tribute.

## **THE PROVINCE OF MISAMIS ORIENTAL**

**The Province of Misamis Oriental is located at the Northern part of Mindanao bounded on the north by the Macajalar Bay, on the west by Iligan Bay, on the East by Agusan del Norte and Gingoog Bay, on south and southwest by both the Provinces of Bukidnon and Lanao del Norte.**

**The name Misamis was derived from the words "Misa" (a Spanish term for the Eucharistic Mass or a Church Rite). When Christianity was new in the Philippines, every time the priests travelled around the province, the Christian converts were usually heard to shout "Misa! Misa! ". Thus over a period of time, the Spanish Missionaries started to call the province by the name "Misamis".**

## **Political Subdivisions**

Misamis used to be a part of the province of Cebu. In 1818 it became a corregimiento comprised of four (4) partidos or divisions: Partido de Misamis, Partido de Dapitan, Partido de Cagayan and Partido de Catarman. During the latter part of the 19th century, Misamis was one of the six (6) districts of Mindanao, and later, one of the seven (7) districts of Mindanao and Sulu at the close of the Spanish era with Cagayan de Misamis, now Cagayan de Oro, as its capital. When it was still a part of the district of Cebu, there were twelve (12) Spaniards and nine (9) Filipinos who successively served as "gobernadores" with Major Jose Carabillo as the first governor in 1874. Legislative Act No. 3537, approved in November 1929, divided the province of Misamis into two provinces due to lack of geographical continuity: Misamis Oriental and Misamis Occidental. However, it was not until ten years later that the division was implemented by Amendment Act No. 3777, adopted on November 28, 1939. When Misamis Oriental became a separate province, Don Gregorio was its first Governor. Since then there were twenty three (23) gubernatorial terms of office occupied by twenty three (23) governors who were elected and appointed by operation of law.



## **Local Governance**

**Act No 3354**, approved in November 30, 1927, divided the province of Misamis into two provinces due to lack of geographical contiguity. The two provinces resulting from this division are Misamis Oriental and Misamis Occidental. However, it was not until twelve (12) years later that the division was implemented by an amendment, Act No. 3777, adopted on November 28, 1939.

When Misamis Oriental became a separate province, Don Gregorio Pelaez was its first Governor. Since then, there were twenty seven (27) gubernatorial terms of office occupied by governors who were either elected or appointed by operations of law. Honorable Vicente Y. Emano was the elected governor of the province in the first local election held on January 18, 1988, after the lifting of martial law. He was re-elected to another term of office as the governor of this province in the May 12, 1992 synchronized (national and local) elections. He was re-elected once more as governor of the province, this time for his third term, on May 1995.

## **Geographical Location**

Misamis Oriental is one of the five provinces of Northern Mindanao. Falling between eight degrees twenty eight minutes thirty eight seconds five hundred sixteen latitude (8028'38"516 Lat.) and one hundred forty two degrees thirty eight minutes thirty five seconds two hundred thirty five Longitude (142038'35"235 Long.), the province is located along the northern coast of the island of Mindanao. The province is bounded on the north by Macajalar Bay, on west by Iligan Bay, on the south and south-west by the provinces of Bukidnon and Lanao de Norte and the east by Agusan del Norte.

## **Climate**

Two types of climates in the province are based on rainfall distribution. The first type, which occurs in the Eastern Municipalities of Kinoguitan to Magsaysay, has a very pronounced maximum rainfall from November to January and generally wet the whole year. The second type, which occurs in the central and western part of the province, is relatively dry from November to April and wet during the rest of the year. It covers the municipalities of Sugbongcogon, in the east and down to Lugait in the west. The climate is usually pleasant with warmer days and cooler nights.

## **Language / Dialects**

Cebuano, Tagalog, Maranao, Hiligayon, Ilonggo, Waray and English.

## **Political Subdivision / Population**

Misamis Oriental is one of the 22 provinces of Mindanao and one of the 4 provinces of new Region 10. It has three cities, Cagayan de Oro, the capital.

El Salvador and Gingoog City, of which are two (2) component cities, Misamis Oriental "Eco Adventure" and twenty four (23) municipalities with Four Hundred Twenty Four

(424) Barangays. The province is divided into districts, comprising the following municipalities with its corresponding 2010 NSCB - PSA population estimates:

#### RELIGION

Almost 80 percent of the populations are Roman Catholics. The rest are either liberal or conservative Protestants, such as Baptists, Seventh Day Adventists, The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints, and Iglesia Ni Kristo. There is a small but growing population of Muslims. Fewer are Buddhists and Hindus.

## **KUYAMIS FESTIVAL OFFICIAL STORYLINE**

The Kuyamis Festival is the official festival of the Province of Misamis Oriental. It was successfully launched on January 8, 2014 during the 84<sup>th</sup> Misamis Oriental Week, a festivity associated with the founding of the province since it became a separate and independent local government unit on January 1, 1930 by virtue of Republic Act 3537 enacted by the Philippine Legislature on November 2, 1929. Since then, each year, every first or second week of January is dedicated to commemorate the birth of Misamis Oriental.

Historical jottings and sources also reveal that the term "Kuyamis" was the original name of Misamis. It is a small and golden, sweet variety of coconut, which was a staple food of the earliest known Negrito settlers of Misamis and also considered to be a fruit of good fortune for the Chinese because of its golden color and shape. The word "Kuyamis" was later corrupted to Misamis during the invasion of the Spanish Colonizers.

The highlight of the Kuyamis Festival is to showcase bountiful harvests, products and by-products made solely out of the TREE of LIFE – the COCONUT. Household, Industrial, Souvenir, Food Items and even Heirloom Recipes that primarily use Coconut, displayed by the different municipalities and cities.

However, the primary purpose of the festivity is to promote the Coconut Industry, Product Development and Eco - Tourism in the Province of Misamis Oriental.

### **THE BLACK NAZARENE**

The Black Nazarene is a life-sized, dark-skinned statue of Jesus Christ, which was carved by an Aztec carpenter. A priest bought the statue in Mexico during the time of the Galleon Trade. The image is now enshrined in the minor basilica in Quiapo, Manila Friday is when devotees go to the church to pay homage. The Feast of the Black Nazarene, celebrated every year on January 8, is one of the largest and most popular religious festivals in the Philippines.

The statue was brought to Manila by the first group of Augustinian Recollect friars on 31 May 1606. Black Nazarene image 400 years in Manila on Wednesday GMA News.</ref> The image was enshrined at the first Recollect church in Bagumbayan (now part of the Rizal Park), which was inaugurated on 10 September 1606 and placed under the patronage of Saint John the Baptist.

In 1608, the second bigger Recollect church dedicated to San Nicolas de Tolentino (Saint Nicholas of Tolentine) was completed inside Intramuros, and the image of *Nuestro Padre Jesús Nazareno* was transferred there. The Recollect Fathers then vigorously promoted devotion to the Suffering of Our Lord represented by the image such that after fifteen short years, the *Cofradia de Jesús Nazareno* was established on

April 21. The confraternity obtained the Papal approval on 20 April 1650 from His Holiness Pope Innocent X.

Sometime in 1787, the Archbishop of Manila, Basilio Sancho de Santas Junta y Rufina, ordered the transfer of the image of the Nazareno to the church in Quiapo, again placed under the patronage of Saint John the Baptist.

The image survived the great fires that destroyed Quiapo Church in 1791 and 1929, as well as the great earthquakes of 1645 and 1863, and the destructive bombing of Manila in 1945 during World War II.

In 1998, however, a replica of the original Black Nazarene was first paraded due to the repeated damages inflicted on the statue. Today, the head and the cross stays on the Altar Mayor of the Minor Basilica, and the original body image of the Black Nazarene is used in the processions. Other, even smaller replica can be found in other churches.

The devotion to *Nuestro Padre Jesús Nazareno* has attracted a huge following. Its initial popularity in the northern and southern provinces of Luzon spread over time throughout the country.

The uniquely Filipino devotion to the Black Nazarene merited the sanction and encouragement of two popes: Innocent X in 1650, with a Papal Bull canonically establishing the *Cofradia de Jesús Nazareno*; and Pius VII in the 19th century, by granting indulgence to those who piously pray before the image of the Black Nazarene of Quiapo.

Today, despite the rough-and-tumble that usually accompanies the thrice-yearly procession of the image, the Filipino people's devotion to God in the special appellation of *Nuestro Padre Jesús Nazareno* continues to flourish and shows no sign of waning—death, wounds, bodily pains and physical discomfort notwithstanding.

For more than 400 years, like the Quiapo the statue has been placed on a gilded carriage every January and is pulled through the streets of Cagayan de Oro and other parts of the country by male devotees dressed in maroon. People who touch the Nazarene are reported to sometimes be healed of diseases. Catholics converge hoping for the chance to get close enough to touch the image and perhaps receive a miracle. They also throw towels to the people guarding the statue and ask them to rub the towel on the statue in hopes of carrying some of that miraculous power away with them.
