Subject : ROVER LEADERSHIP TRAINING, ORIENTATION AND VIGIL

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1. Boy Scouts of the Philippines –Misamis Oriental Council , in consonance with DepEd Order No. 75, s. 2012 re: Revitalizing Boy Scouting in Schools Nationwide will conduct Rover Leadership Training ,Orientation and Vigil on February 5-6, 2016 at Sta Ana National HighSchool, Sta Ana Tagoloan, Misamis Oriental.
 2. The Rover Leadership Training will be participated in by Grade 9 and Grade 10 from Casinglot National High School, Tagoloan National High School, Rosario National High School and the host school Sta. Ana National High School of Tagoloan District, Tagoloan, Misamis Oriental.
 3. Each participant is required to pay a training fee of ONE HUNDRED (PhP 150.00) to cover cost of registration to BSP, certificates and other administrative and operational expenses.
 4. Participants must bring their own food provisions, extra clothes and personal kit, a handkerchief large enough to cover their eyes for the wandering and sense activities.
 5. In consideration of the DepEd policy on "Time on Task" the Rover Leadership Training and Orientation will commence on Friday at 5:30 pm and expected to end on Saturday at 9:00 a.m.

ROVER SCOUTING PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

The following educational objectives were prepared for this particular age section, established according to the knowledge, skills and attitudes that a young person could reasonably be expected to have gained in the various areas of development by the end of that age section.

1. Contribute to the education of young adults in a non-formal way through a value system based on the Scout Oath & Law.
2. Contribute to the moral and spiritual uplift of young adults while respecting their religious convictions.
3. Assist young adults in developing decision-making skills and accountability.
4. Provide a specific method by which young adults may become self-reliant.
5. Prepare young adults for service during emergencies.
6. Provide young adults opportunities to develop physical fitness.
7. Prepare young adults for leadership in the Boy Scouts of the Philippines.
8. Train young adults in skills for socio-economic development.
9. Prepare young adults for responsible citizenship.
10. Provide opportunities for active leadership and participation in community projects that will promote environmental development and healthful living.
11. Promote desirable Filipino customs and traditions.
12. Provide young adults opportunities to develop awareness of family responsibilities.
13. Cooperate with kindred youth groups and other agencies in worthwhile undertakings.
14. Promote international relations as a means of understanding, peace and brotherhood.

PROGRAM CHARACTERISTICS

- A. It is essentially a "Brotherhood of the open air and Service" carried out through activities that are also values-forming such as expeditions, outdoor living, group jogging, and other "outdoor" activities common to Scouting, in an atmosphere of freedom, as hikers of the open road and campers of the woods.
Starting with service to self to enable them to a better render service to others, the members are introduced to service to the Movement in preparation for the greater scope of service, which is the community. The community can be his neighborhood or the community of nations.
- B. It has no structured program, which requires members to accomplish certain requirements in order to advance.
- C. Advancement is optional depending on the individual member's desire. Participation in activities, accomplishment of individual or group projects, or acceptance and accomplishment of assignments/tasks may be credited for advancement.
- D. Activities may be as diverse as the unit's membership composition although emphasis will be on brotherhood, open-air, civic/community service and community development activities. These may be carried out either individually or as a group.
- E. It is based on the individual's acceptance of the "Panunumpa at Batas ng Scout," a basic requirement for Scout Membership.
- F. It is open to male and female members per BSP N.O. Memorandum No. 33 s. 2003 dated June 09, 2003.
